**Champagne, Prosecco & Sparkling Wine**

**England**

- 1. Maidens Harvest Sparkling Wine, Barnsole, 2014 49.5**

*A traditional bottle fermented white sparkling wine made with a blend of Reichensteiner and Huxlerebe to make an approachable dry and balanced wine with an excellent fruity finish. This wine is matured in the bottle for 18 months prior to release.*

**France**

- 2. Baron Fuente Brut Grande Réserve, Champagne, N.V. 9.5 / 39.5**

*A pale yellow colour and a bouquet of apple, peach and pear. In the mouth, the wine is balanced and interlaced with vinous aromas and fruit, supported by a good structure.*

- 3. Champagne Duchatel Cuvée de Prestige Vintage, 2007 14 / 59.5**

*Exclusive to The Dog! The term Cuvée de Prestige denotes luxury - the finest Champagne that money can buy. Stunning champagne with the fullness and intensity of Pinot Noir, the typical rich fruit and sweetness of Pinot Meunier and the delicate creamy finesse characteristic of aged Chardonnay.*

- 4. Champagne Bollinger Special Cuvée Brut, N.V. 66**

*A subtle combination of structure, length and vivacity; bubbles like velvet; pear, brioche and spicy aromas, notes of fresh walnut.*

- 5. Champagne Moët Ice Imperial, N.V. 70**

*The broad, fleshy, voluptuous flavour of a fresh fruit salad with captivating sweetness of caramel and quince jelly and a refreshing acidity of grapefruit and ginger notes.*

- 6. Champagne Laurent Perrier Cuvée Rosé Brut, N.V. 80**

*Forthright, and very fresh on the nose. The wine suggests a basketful of small berry fruits: strawberries, raspberries, blackcurrants, blackberries, redcurrants, Morello and black cherries.*

**7. Champagne Dom Pérignon Brut, 2006**

**190**

*Long and satisfying on the palate with layers of yeasty, nutty flavours, superbly fat and ripe. Dom Pérignon is vintage champagne only. Each Vintage wine is created from the finest grapes grown in one single year. Reinventing itself by interpreting the unique character of the seasons. Daring not to release a Vintage if the harvest does not meet its ideal.*

**8. Champagne Louis Roederer, Cristal Vintage, 2007**

**220**

*Cristal is a remarkably balanced and refined champagne whose length is inimitable. It has a silky texture and fruity aromas, complemented by a powerful mineral quality with white fruit and citrus notes.*

**9. Prosecco 'Extra Dry' FONTE**

**6 / 29.5**

*Vibrant gold in colour with the aromas of green apple and summer flowers, this added with the flavours of citrus and pear, and the bubbles, fine, generous and pleasant - a party in the making.*

**10. 'Redentore', Rosé Millesimato, de Stefani, Veneto, 2017**

**7 / 34**

*Enjoyable Italian sparkling wine with apple and pear aromas and flavours plus hints of citrus and jasmine. Lively, refreshing, organic and vegetarian/vegan friendly.*

**White Wine**

**England**

**11. Dry Reserve, Barnsole, 2015 32**

*A fruit packed dry white wine made from 100% Reichensteiner, delivering complex fruits and great body, A classic style to compliment a special dinner with friends.*

**France**

**12. Picpoul de Pinet, Réserve Mirou, 2016 4.5 / 6.3 / 8.9 / 25**

*The Picpoul grape has been grown around the sleepy village of Pinet, close to the Mediterranean coast, for centuries. Surprisingly bright and fresh for a wine produced in such a warm climate, it's rather like a fuller bodied Muscadet with plenty of citrusy fruit: as such it makes for a good food wine and is particularly good with seafood.*

**13. Viognier, Domaine des Lauriers, IGP d'Oc, 2016 5.2 / 7.3 / 9.9 / 28**

*Ripe and mouth filling dry white from the Mediterranean coast of France with exotic fruit flavours of apricots and peaches.*

**14. Pinot Blanc, Kuentz Bas, 2015 35**

*Fresh fruit and white flowers dominate the nose, with suggestions of something smoky. Fresh, balanced and fruity palate, with added texture and body due to the addition of Auxerrois (Alsatian grape variety related to Chardonnay).*

**15. Chablis, Domaine Fournillon, 2014 38**

*A wonderfully well balanced and rounded Chablis, with crisp notes of green apples. While on the palate the freshness continues and some lovely hints of minerality and even more green apples and hints of pear giving you a long finish and a zippy acidity.*

**16. Sancerre, Domaine La Clef du Récit, A. Girard, Loire, 2016 44**

*Classic dry white with aromas and flavours of ripe citrus fruits and a lively acidity. Stylish and appetising.*

**17. Pouilly Fuissé, Domaine Cordier, Burgundy, 2015 48**

*Who needs to venture to the Côte d'Or when you can get wines like this from further south? Fantastic white Burgundy with masses of ripe fruit and spicy oak.*

**18. Chassagne-Montrachet, Domaine Bernard Moreau et Fils, 2013 60**

*A delightful bouquet: clean and pure with apricot and light fig scents infusing the citrus fruit. The palate offers commendable weight in the mouth; the acidity is very finely judged and lends the finish impressive tension.*

**Italy**

**19. Torre Dei Vescovi Pinot Grigio, 2017 4.5 / 6.3 / 9.5 / 26**

*Golden yellow in colour, it is delicate and complex with floral notes. Presenting a velvety smooth, pleasantly fresh dry finish.*

**20. Gavi la Battistina, Piemonte, 2016 34**

*Gavi La Battistina is a fresh vibrant wine with citrus fruit produced from the Cortese grape. Well rounded with good weight and a clean, crisp finish.*

**New Zealand**

**21. Sauvignon Blanc, Mount Beautiful, North Canterbury, 2014 6.4 / 8.9 / 12 / 34**

*A wonderful example of New Zealand Sauvignon - full of creamy tropical fruitiness yet still fresh, with a crisp, mineral finish.*

**South Africa**

**22. Cullinan View Chenin Blanc, Western Cape, 2017 19**

*South Africa's most popular grape variety. Youthful, fruity character and a fresh, zesty acidity. Very well-balanced.*

**23. Sauvignon Blanc, Vondeling, Voor Pardeberg, 2016 4.9 / 6.8 / 9.8 / 26**

*The aromas on the nose carry through beautifully to a charged, fruit driven palate with subtle zing, some flintiness and the lingering taste of guava.*

**Spain**

- 24. Macabeo 'Fuente Verde', Bodegas Monfil, Cariñena, 2016** **3.8 / 5.2 / 7.3 / 21**

*Light, fresh and gently fruity dry white from this family-owned bodega.  
Uncomplicated easy drinking and great value.*

- 25. 2 Amigos Albarino, 2017** **5.7 / 7.9 / 11 / 30**

*Stylish 'New' Spain, white peach, apricot, citrus fruits and hints of jasmine, dry  
and lively with firm fresh acidity, delicious.*

- 26. Rioja Blanco Bodegas Launa, 2016** **30**

*It is medium-bodied and wonderfully refreshing, with notes of citrus and tropical  
fruit. The acidity is just high enough to allow it to easily pair with a variety of  
foods. Very appealing food oriented-style.*

**Rosé Wine**

**England**

- 27. English Rosé, Hush Heath, Kent, 2015 36**

*Beautifully pale onion skin in colour. Fresh, red summer fruit with a delicate herbal finish. Characteristic English acidity with hints of wild strawberry and white currant on the palate, the finish is long and vinous.*

**France**

- 28. Rare Vineyards Cinsault Vieilles Vignes Rosé Pays d'Oc, 2017 4.3 / 6 / 8 / 22**

*Made from 100% Cinsault and cool-fermented and bottled early to capture all the fresh summer-fruit flavours. Shows notes of raspberry and cherry on a refreshing palate.*

- 29. Coteaux Varois En Provence 'Cuvée M', Domaine Saint Mitre, 2017 6.2 / 8.5 / 11.9 / 32**

*Beautiful 'Provence' Rosé, pale pink in colour with elegant floral aromas and the flavours of fresh strawberries and summer fruits, a classy wine.*

## Red Wine

### Argentina

**30. Malbec, Bodegas Septima, Mendoza, 2015 5.2 / 7.3 / 10 / 28**

*Intense violet in colour with the flavour of sweet fruits – plums, blackberries and quince, soft tannins with a hint of vanilla from its time in oak.*

### England

**31. Red Reserve, Barnsole, 2013 33**

*A harmonious blend of Rondo and Regent red varieties make this medium bodied ruby red wine, showing redcurrants and a sense of delicate spice with soft tannins and good length.*

### France

**32. Élevé Pinot Noir, 2017 4.3 / 6 / 8.5 / 24**

*Pinot Noir grapes from vineyards in the south-west of the Languedoc Roussillon region, near the Pyrénées; about a third of the blend is aged in French oak. Shows cherry and blueberry flavours on the soft palate, finishes with a hint of spice.*

**33. Merlot, Domaine Baptiste Boutes, IGP d'Oc, 2015 4.9 / 6.9 / 10 / 28**

*Classic plummy Merlot fruitiness, mellow tannins and lovely soft texture. The quality of a St. Emilion at a much lower price.*

**34. Boutinot 'Les Coteaux' Cotes Du Rhone Villages, 2014 32**

*Elegant berry-fruit aromas backed with a hint of cedar and spice, soft supple tannins marrying into the cherry-fruit flavours result in a wine that is rich and smooth.*

**35. Château Penin, Bordeaux Supérieur, 2014 34**

*From an estate acknowledged by top wine writers as one of most reliable sources for great value claret this has the classic combination of black fruits savoury tannins and a dash of appetising acidity.*

**36. Fleurie, Pascal Clément, 2016 36**

*The most feminine of the Beaujolais crus, partly due to the complexity of its light floral aromas and its silky elegance; the romantically named Fleurie appellation is made from grapes exclusively harvested around the village of the same name. Grown on pure granite soil, it has a bright red colour with violet glints and a bouquet of iris, rose and raspberry, the palate is fresh and supple.*

**37. Château Hourtin Ducasse, Cru Bourgeois, Bordeaux 2010 44**

*This beautiful, structured wine is a classic Haut Médoc! Full and complex with ripe berry flavours, and rounded off with smooth, yet bold tannins.*

**38. La Fleur Penin, St. Emilion Grand Cru, 2014 46**

*A generous, aromatic nose of ripe red fruits with a touch of spice and liquorice. Medium to full bodied with great concentration, a lovely softness and an elegance enhanced by silky tannins. This wine demonstrates that even in St-Emilion, you can still find fantastic quality at reasonable prices.*

**39. Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Bois de Pied Redal, Ogier, 2016 48**

*The vineyard of Pied Redal, with its pebble and sandy soils, is cultivated without any weed-killers or pesticides and certified organic. The blend is mainly Grenache, with Syrah, Mourvèdre and Cinsault. Shows dark fruit flavours, such as black cherry and blackcurrant, spiced with liquorice and aromatic herbs; the palate is full-bodied with fine-grained tannins which give it a smooth finish.*

**40. Givry 1er Cru 'Clos Jus', Laurent Mouton, Burgundy, 2015 50**

*Great value red Burgundy, drinking beautifully now. Concentrated red fruit flavours of the Pinot grape, herbal notes and savoury tannins.*

**41. Le Relais de Durfort-Vivens, Margaux, 2011 60**

*The second wine of Château Durfort-Vivens; a blend of 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot and 15% Cabernet Franc, generally from the younger vines, that sees less oak ageing. Minerally, autumn fruit compote, with blackberry and plum, spice and high violet notes.*

**Italy**

- 42. Palazzo del Mare Nero d'Avola, 2017** **3.8 / 5.4 / 7.6 / 20**  
*Ample ripe, plummy fruit, hints of spice and liquorice, red and cherry fruits, this wine is deliciously supple and juicy.*

- 43. Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, Villa Medoro, 2015** **6.3 / 8.8 / 12 / 33**  
*Prizewinning, savoury red with blackberry, cherry and cassis notes; along with the classic touch of spice that defines a good Montepulciano.*

- 44. Bolgheri Rosso, Donna Olimpia 1898, 2013** **40**  
*Elegant Italian blend of Bordeaux grape varieties. Aromas and flavours of black fruits with hints of spice, liquorice and chocolate. Ripe and mouthfilling with savoury tannins and an appetising acidity.*

**New Zealand**

- 45. Pinot Noir, Mt. Beautiful, North Canterbury, 2015** **36**  
*Sophisticated fragrances of black cherries and violets and an elegantly expressive palate of ripe bramble fruit and subtle tannins. As the personal favorite of the owner David Teece, it's incredibly important for the Pinot Noir to showcase the best aspects of the varietal.*

**South Africa**

- 46. False Bay 'Old School' Syrah 2016** **4.2 / 5.9 / 8.4 / 23**  
*Very smart Shiraz, polished and seriously appealing, cassis and black cherry - a real 'fruit bomb' with fine tannins giving a long and lingering finish*

**Spain**

- 47. Garnacha 'Fuente Verde', Bodegas Monfil, Cariñena, 2015**  
**3.9 / 5.5 / 7.9 / 22**  
*Soft and ripe fruity red with hints of savoury tannins and herbs. Dangerously quaffable and good value for money.*

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- 48. Rioja Crianza, Bodegas Launa, 2014** **6.3 / 8.8 / 12 / 34**

*The classic Rioja combination of ripe, soft fruitiness and savoury oakiness. This wine definitely over-delivers for its price.*

- 49. Monastrell 'Macho Man', Casa Rojo, Jumilla, 2016** **40**

*Hand-harvested grapes from old vines provide the raw material for this big and boisterous wine with flavours of red and black fruit with mineral and balsamic notes.*

### **Alcohol Free Wine**

#### **Germany**

- 50. Eisberg Alcohol Free Sauvignon Blanc Wine** **15**

*Fresh, aromatic Sauvignon Blanc with classic gooseberry and tropical fruit flavours.*

- 51. Eisberg Cabernet Sauvignon Alcohol Free Red Wine** **15**

*Fresh and fruity Cabernet Sauvignon with ripe cassis and berry flavours.*

#### **Spain**

- 52. Codorniu Zero Alcohol Sparkling Wine** **18**

*A de-alcoholised sparkler made from the Airen variety, showing fresh sweet tropical fruit, apple and citrus flavours on a rich, fruity palate. The alcohol is gently removed by an innovative vacuum distillation system at low temperatures, minimising the loss of flavour characteristics.*

**France**

- 53. Sauternes, Château Monteils, Bordeaux, 2009 (375ml) 7.5 / 25**

*Luscious yet still fresh with ripe honeyed fruitiness. Ripe and mouth filling. A fine example of the wines of this famous appellation.*

- 54. Banyuls 'Robert Pages', Domaine Madeloc, Roussillon, N.V. 6 / 35**

*Exotic red fortified wine from the coast of the Mediterranean - sweet and fruity with flavours of plums, baked figs and coffee.*

**Portugal**

- 55. Port Reserva, Ramos Pinto N.V. 5.5 / 28**

*The perfect end...from one of the few remaining family-owned Port lodges.*

- 56. Taylor's Late Bottled Vintage Port 2011, 750ml 6 / 30**

*Classic Late Bottled Vintage Port wine, from top quality producer.*
